




# 2024 Annual Report

### How does the program work?



- Enrolls local children ages 0-5
- Pays mailing cost per child per month to deliver the books to the home
- Promotes progam to drive enrollment and funding.

## IMAGINATION LIBRARY

- Provides the enrollment database and support.
- Coordinates Blue Ribbon Book Selection Committee.
- Coordinates monthly book order and shipment.



Books arrive monthly at a child's home at NO COST to the family.
